OUR LITTLE GUY IS ALL OF 5 YEARS OLD, THIS STORY WILL FOCUS ON HIS EXPERIENCE ON THE 4TH OF JULY AND NOT SO MUCH THE NEGATIVE STIGMA THAT FOLLOWS AUTISM. WE HAD TO LEAVE THE HOUSE RIGHT BEFORE THE FIREWORKS STARTED BECAUSE PATIENCE IS A HUGE FACTOR, LIKE MYSELF HE HAS NO PATIENCE. HE IS NON-VERBAL BUT THE EXPRESSIONS ON HIS LITTLE FACE TELLS SO MANY STORIES JUST LIKE "A PICTURE TELLS A STORY".

AS SOON AS THE FIREWORKS WERE UNDERWAY, A LOOK OF AMAZEMENT CAME ACROSS HIS FACE AS HE STARED INTO THE SKY THAT LIT UP LIKE A CHRISTMAS TREE IN JULY.

HE REACHED FOR ALL OF THE BEAUTIFUL LIGHTS HOPING HE COULD CATCH JUST ONE IN HIS TINY HAND. EVERYONE OF THEM, IN A NEW COLOR AND SHAPE HE SMILES.

HE LOOKS BACK AT ME AS TO SAY THIS IS UNBELIEVABLE AND OH SO BEAUTIFUL. MORE EXCITEMENT CAME WHEN THE FINALE STARTED, ONE RIGHT AFTER ANOTHER AND HIS SMILE GREW BIGGER.
